White Mountain Eagle Fest, Saturday Feb. 25

The Arizona Game and Fish Department is partnering again with the White Mountain Nature Center in Pinetop-Lakeside, Ariz., for this year's Eagle Fest.

Eagle Fest will open starting at 9 a.m. with a Family Friendly program, followed by a live eagle presentation by Liberty Wildlife and a presentation about eagles in Arizona from Phoenix, and even more information from an AZGFD biologist.

Then, bald eagle viewing will be available to all participants from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at nearby Lazy Oaks Resort on Rainbow Lake to observe bald eagle behavior firsthand, weather permitting. AZGFD biologists and experienced naturalists will be there along with a limited number of binoculars and spotting scopes.

Participants are advised to dress appropriately for weather conditions for that day and to bring a set of binoculars or spotting scope for improved observation. Directions to the viewing location will be available at the Nature Center.
