MORE News from the White Mountain Nature Center

Oct 8th, Dr. Randy Fuller updated WMNC Guests on the Forest Service's 4FRI Initiative





Dr. Fuller has over 40 years of experience in academia, private business, and public service, including the last 14 years which he spent working with the U.S. Forest Service. He explained the Four Forest Restoration Initiative, which covers over 6 million acres of the Kaibab, Coconino, Tonto and Apache-Sitgraves National Forests. Attendees were amazed to learn that the Arizona portion of 4FRI is over 300 miles from end-to-end and takes 8 hours to drive! He also talked about working on the large landscape fires in northern California's Sierra Nevada forests. The audience appreciated his insights regarding modern methods of fire suppression and prevention.
